

VINTAGE WRAP COLLAR APRON

Materials needed:

1 ½ Yd. 45" wide fabric

2 Pkgs. double fold bias tape to match

Thread to match

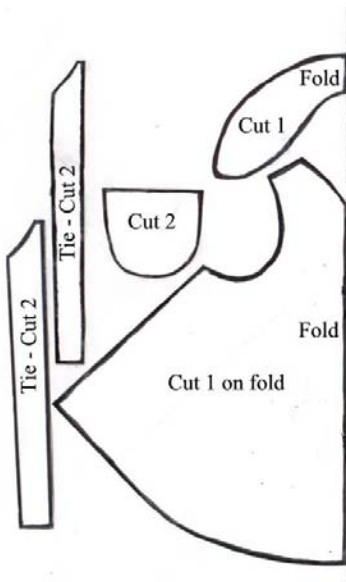
4 matching medium size buttons or 2 large matching buttons

Printing The Pattern Pieces

This downloadable epattern will print out as a tiled image that will need to be taped together in the following layout (page locations are printed in the upper left corner of each page).

1,1	2,1	3,1	4,1	5,1
1,2	2,2	3,2	4,2	5,2
1,3	2,3	3,3	4,3	5,3

Pattern layout on fabric:



Lay pattern pieces on fabric as shown above. Cut.

Pin each set of apron ties right sides together. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams all around, leaving the short straight end open. Turn ties right side out and press.



Sew double fold bias tape around pockets, collar and apron.



Pin pockets in place (you can see the pins in the picture above) and sew.

Pin apron ties in place (as marked under the armhole on the pattern), and sew.



To attach the collar, pin the collar into position along the shoulder lines. Sew one large button or two medium size buttons in place to secure the collar to the apron.
